A "treatise on man" was planned by Descartes as early as 1629, as part of an explanation of "all natural phenomena, that is, all of physics " (AT I 70, CSMK 7), as indicated by the summary of the "treatise on light" in the Discourse on Method. According to that summary, the treatise would contain a discussion not only of celestial and terrestrial bodies but also of man "because he observes them" (AT VI 42, CSM I 132).
