Young children have disproportionately large body surface areas, and heat loss is exaggerated during anesthesia, especially during the induction of anesthesia, unless this is actively prevented. 4 Hypothermia, particularly in neonates, delays the metabolism and excretion of anesthetic agents and can also potentiate neuromuscular blockade. 5

During a general anaesthetic, medicines are used to send you to sleep, so you're unaware of surgery and do not move or feel pain while it's carried out. General anaesthesia is essential for some surgical procedures where it may be safer or more comfortable for you to be unconscious.

Anesthesia today is very safe. In very rare cases, anesthesia can cause complications in children (such as strange heart rhythms, breathing problems, allergic reactions to medications, and even death). The risks depend on the kind of procedure, the condition of the patient, and the type of anesthesia used.

General anesthesia: Under general anesthesia, your child will be completely asleep and pain free. Specially-trained anesthesia professionals (physicians, dentists, or certified nurse anesthetists) will administer medications and monitor your child while a separate dentist or oral surgeon performs the dental procedure or surgery.

Anaesthesia is relatively safe and can be given to children of all ages, including newborn babies. The anaesthetist's role is to ensure your child is comfortable and pain free. The anaesthetist will stay with them at all times during the operation and monitor them closely

REGIONAL BLOCK ANAESTHESIA INFERIOR ALVEOLAR AND LINGUAL NERVE BLOCKS Administration of this blocks are easier to perform successfully in children than adults (because of the relative position mandibular foramen to the occlusal level) Best performed with child's mouth fully open. 21.

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
