Healthy children are the foundation of a healthy future Remarkable progress has been made in improving child survival over the past 25 years. Since 1990, child mortality rates have been reduced by more than half. Under-five deaths dropped from 12.7 million per year in 1990 to 5.9 million in 2015.

There has been a concerted effort during the past few years by governments and organizations to improve child health and survival in developing countries. UNICEF has been in the forefront of this effort through its GOBI-FFF programme; G=Growth monitoring, O=Oral rehydration therapy, B=Breast feeding, I=Immunization, F=Female education, F=Family spacing, and F=Food supplements.

Child survival is a field of public health concerned with reducing child mortality. Child survival interventions are designed to address the most common causes of child deaths that occur, which include diarrhea, pneumonia, malaria, and neonatal conditions. Of the portion of children under the age of 5 alone, an estimated 5.6 million children die each year mostly from such preventable causes.

In 2019 an estimated 5.2 million children under 5 years died mostly from preventable and treatable causes. Children aged 1 to 11 months accounted for 1.5 million of these deaths while children aged 1 to 4 years accounted for 1.3 million deaths. Newborns (under 28 days) accounted for the remaining 2.4 million deaths.

Children: improving survival and well-being

This improvement of child health would still mean terrible suffering: 86 million child deaths in the SDG era. And while these UN projections expect a further improvement of global child health this trajectory would fall short of reaching the SDG. The scenario in green shows what it would mean to reach the SDGs.

Current coverage for many of these interventions is extremely variable, with big contrasts between rural and urban populations for some basic newborn and child survival interventions such as skilled care at birth, measles vaccination, and nutrition support programmes tackling chronic under-nutrition problems such as stunting (see fig D on bmj.com).

Child Health The world has made substantial progress in reducing child mortality in the past few decades. Globally, the under-five mortality rate dropped from 93 deaths per 1,000 live births in 1990 to 41 in 2016. This remarkable progress in improving child survival since 2000 has saved the lives of 50 million children under age five.

The factors examined to explain potential child survival inequalities among ethnic groups included residence in the largest city, household economic conditions, educational attainment and nutritional status of the mothers, use of modern maternal and child health services including immunization, and patterns of fertility and migration.
