### Constructivist Teaching: Principles & Explanation - Video ...

The constructivist model of teaching enables learners to construct knowledge,

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whether this construction reflects objective realities, or the construction is perceived to sharpen one's cognitive development for acquiring higher-level intellectual development, or the construction of knowledge should happen in a social interactive setting with the mediation of individuals.

### Constructivist Learning and Teaching

Constructivism calls upon each student to build knowledge through experience such that knowledge can't simply be transferred from the teacher to student. As such, teachers play a facilitation role. For example, a school that has students pursue their own projects with the teacher playing a advisory role.

Constructivist teaching methods are based on constructivist learning theory. Along with John Dewey, Jean Piaget researched childhood development and education. Their theories are now encompassed in the broader movement of progressive education. Constructivist learning theory says that all knowledge is constructed from a base of prior knowledge.

### Constructivist teaching methods - Teacher education

Simply put, subscribing to a constructivist

view of learning affects teaching, classroom practices, and student classroom behavior. Von Glaserfeld (1993) calls constructivism a theory of knowing, as opposed to a theory of knowledge.
