Soren Kierkegaard, in full Soren Aabye Kierkegaard, (born May 5, 1813, Copenhagen, Den.--died Nov. 11, 1855, Copenhagen), Danish philosopher, theologian, and cultural critic who was a major influence on existentialism and Protestant theology in the 20th century. He attacked the literary, philosophical, and ecclesiastical establishments of his day for misrepresenting the highest task of human existence--namely, becoming oneself in an ethical and religious sense--as something so easy that ...

Kierkegaard defined an ethical life as when one becomes conscious of themselves. Thus, it does not mean changing a person into someone else but rather changing into an individual. In this sense, 'ethics' represents the 'universal' and prevailing the social norms. These social norms are what are used to justify actions within communities.

As Mason explains, Kierkegaard thought that an individual's life is defined by what one relates themselves to. The aesthetic life is lived when an individual relates to themselves. That is, such an individual lives for themselves, and seeks out novel experiences of beauty and pleasure. The ethical life is lived when an individual relates (and thus defines) themselves to other people.

For centuries philosopher and theologians have debated the existence of God and the legitimacy of religion, trying to justify faith through logic. The ethics of philosophy By insisting that any philosophical investigation of human existence must take its starting point in the fact that the philosopher is a particular human being, Kierkegaard places ethics at the centre of philosophical activity. However, the fact that ethics occupies such a central role in his thinking is often overlooked.

Kierkegaard interprets Abrahamic faith as agreeing with Hegel and Marx about this historical finitude of reason, and, precisely because of this, he insists that the voice of God is an authority that is higher than the rationality of either the current establishment (Hegel) or the revolution (Marx). Against both Hegel and Marx, Kierkegaard holds that history is not the scene in which human reason overcomes this finitude and becomes the ultimate standard of truth.

In a book Kierkegaard signed with his own name called Purity of Heart, he puts it this way, "Purity of heart is to will one thing." To become Oneself is to have a direct relation to God, to cease being double-minded or self-deceived. Ethical terms are not part of an aesthete's vocabulary.

In addition to being dubbed "the father of existentialism," Kierkegaard is best known as a trenchant critic of Hegel and Hegelianism and for his invention or elaboration of a host of philosophical, psychological, literary and theological categories, including: anxiety, despair, melancholy, repetition, inwardness, irony, existential stages, inherited sin, teleological suspension of the ethical, Christian paradox, the absurd, reduplication, universal/exception, sacrifice, love as a duty ...

Kierkegaard, importantly, is not an ethicist and does not provide a normative ethical system. When he talks about the ethical, he is talking about the middle sphere in his three spheres, as distinct from the aesthetic and the religious. The ethical is between the airiness of the aesthetic and the intense individuation of the religious.
