There are 3 main parts of an IELTS Speaking test (part 1: Introduction & Interview, part 2: Cue Card/Candidate Task Card & part 3: Details discussion) and the assessment of the examinees is done twice for clarity.

The examiner will ask scripted questions and will listen to your answer, prompting you to extend your response with a " why? " or " why not? " if your answer is too short. This part of the test follows a question-answer format focusing on your ability to communicate opinions and information on everyday topics by answering a range of questions.
