The future play may involve a wild game with opposite-side castling, or an attempt by White to slowly squeeze Black using his space advantage. Pros:

I used to play the King's Indian Defence as Black only when opponents committed to an early Nf3, and I would switch to the Janowski Indian , Tango or Budapest if they didn't. This way I could avoid the dreaded Four Pawns Attack and Sämisch Variation. But I recently decided to commit to the King's Indian completely, which means learning a defense against everything White can throw at you.

The Samisch used to be the Main Line against the KID. 5.Nf3 only overtook it in the last 20 years. It gives you as White some of the same plusses as the Makagonov in that it controls g4. It, like 5.h3, is also a possible precursor for a Kingside attack.

Kings Indian Defence - Your Ace in the Hole

The King's Indian Defence is a chess opening for black that can be played when your opponent begins starts with d4, the Queen's pawn opening. The main idea for black is to let white gain initial space in the center while black develops minor pieces to attack the center later. This makes the King's Indian a Hypermodern opening where black delays attacking the center with pawns.

The Samisch Variation of the King's Indian defense is quite popular, although not the most popular. In my opinion, the reason is that many White players are actually afraid of the King's Indian in general, so when they play against it they try to keep things as much as possible under control.

The Samisch Variation (4. a3) is where White lets Black execute his c- pawns (by trading the bishop for the Knight). This, in general, is white's worst option since Black typically gains an advantageous game.

Seirawan Variation 5.Bd3 [E70]
In the Seirawan system, 5.Bd3 0-0 6.Nge2 Nc6 7.0-0 e5 8.d5 Nd4, the move 9.Bg5 is an old favourite of Seirawan himself. After 9...h6 10.Bb4: 10...Nxe2+!? is a new idea.
