Overview | Head injury: assessment and early management ...

Siba Prosdad Paul Consultant paediatrician, Torbay Hospital, Torquay, England. Head injury is the most common cause of injury-related death and permanent disability in children. Minor head trauma is common in childhood and does not require any medical treatment. Although deficits can occur even after mild to moderate head injury, they are markedly greater and become clinically evident following severe head injury.

Management of head injuries in children - RCNi

Although bruising is the commonest presenting feature of physical abuse in children, this protocol covers all actual or suspected injuries to non-mobile children. Research has shown that children who present with a severe non- accidental injury have often been seen earlier with bruising or another injury – a sentinel injury.

The primary goal in the management of syndesmotic injuries is to achieve stable, anatomic alignment of the ankle joint, regardless of patient age, or method of management. 32 Most agree that ligamentous syndesmotic injuries, which retain the normal bony relationship of the distal TF joint, can be managed without surgery. Nonoperative treatment of syndesmosis injuries often begins with some ...

Management of Syndesmotic Ankle Injuries in Children and ...

The recommendation on the Glasgow Coma Scale (GCS) score is based on NICE which specifies that people with a head injury should have a CT head scan within 1 hour if their GCS score is less than 13 (less than 14 for children, or less than 15 for children under 1 year of age) on initial assessment in the emergency department, or less than 15 at 2 hours after the injury, or if they have other risk factors for skull fracture or other intracranial complication [NICE, 2014c].

Sports Injuries: Types, Treatments, Prevention, and More

RESULTS: Forty-two children were treated for duodenal injuries. There were 33 blunt and 9 penetrating injuries. Injuries were classified using the Organ Injury Scale for the Duodenum. Twenty-four patients underwent operative management by primary repair (18), duodenal resection and gastrojejunostomy (4), or pyloric exclusion (2).

Management of duodenal injuries in children.

Cardiac monitor – Electrical injury? IV access 2 large bore IVs Unburned skin preferred If not available, burned skin preferred to cut-down and central lines (infection) In children Interosseus infusions preferred if venous access not otherwise available

Acute Management of Burns in Children

Tetanus vaccination in Children; Tissue adhesives (management of accidental injury) Torticollis (congenital and acquired) in children; Tranexamic acid in paediatric surgery and trauma; Trauma team activation pathway, paediatric; Trauma team roles and responsibilities. Trauma team triggers, paediatric; Unidentified Foods/Vegetables/Plants and Fungi etc

Hand and finger fractures

Management of injuries to the anterior teeth of preschool children is directed toward minimizing potential damage to the developing permanent teeth; therefore, heroic measures to save primary teeth are not indicated. Crown fractures in the permanent dentition, even those exposing the dental pulp, can be successfully treated hours after an injury.
