Her most significant works in these areas have been *Educating for Intelligent Belief or Unbelief* (1993) and *Philosophy of Education* (1995). Noddings' contribution to education philosophy centers around the ethic of care. Her belief was that a caring teacher-student relationship will result in the teacher designing a differentiated curriculum for each student, and that this curriculum would be based around the students' particular interests and needs.

Educational philosophy questions involve such issues as a teacher's vision of their role as a teacher, their view of how students learn best, and their basic goals for their students. An educational philosophy should guide a teacher's discussions in job interviews, and it should be communicated to students and their parents.
