The saying that someone "can't see the forest for the trees" means that he is so involved with the details of a situation that he loses sight of the larger issue. It is a fairly common expression in English, though the use of "for" can be confusing for some people, since it is a more archaic meaning in this idiom.

In short, we lose our perspective when we are too heavily invested in a particular situation, approach, organization, etc.
