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educational and career choices are made, and (3) how academic and career success is obtained. The theory incorporates a variety of concepts (e.g., interests, abilities, values, environmental factors) that appear in earlier career theories and have been found to affect career development.

Social Cognitive Learning Theory ' s Limitations, Strengths ...

In social learning theory, Albert Bandura (1977) agrees with the behaviorist learning theories of classical conditioning and operant conditioning. However, he adds two important ideas: Mediating processes occur between stimuli & responses. Behavior is learned from the environment through the process of observational learning.

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Social cognitive theory favors a model of causation involving triadic reciprocal determinism. In this model of reciprocal causation, behavior, cognition and other personal factors, and environmental influences all operate as interacting determinants that influence each other bidirectionally (Figure 1).

Cognitive development stems from social interactions from guided learning within the zone of proximal development as children and their partner's co-construct knowledge. In contrast, Piaget maintains that cognitive development stems largely from independent explorations in which children construct knowledge of

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their own.

Piaget's 4 Stages of Cognitive Development Explained
Expectation is the first key concept of Social Learning Theory. Expectation means that a person's knowledge

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has much to do with what he expects out of society, and his beliefs are related to what he believes the outcomes of his actions will be. In other words, he expects something to happen, and this is the base of his knowledge about society.

Social cognitive theory, originated by psychologist Albert Bandura, posits a reciprocal relationship between people and their environment, wherein people are both influenced by and active producers of their surroundings. It also puts an emphasis on observational learning, so that people learn and reproduce behavior through observing others.
