Society Lotteries. Lotteries (or raffles) can only be run for good causes. Society lotteries are promoted for the benefit of a non-commercial society. A society is non-commercial if it is established and conducted: for charitable purposes; for the purpose of enabling participation in, or of supporting, sport, athletics or a cultural activity

Society lotteries - National Lottery Commission

Report backs up view that Society Lotteries complement the National Lottery. The Lotteries Council has welcomed today's report by the National Audit Office on funding for good causes - in particular its positive comments on the relationship between Society Lotteries and the National Lottery. Today's report states that "The Department is not aware of any evidence of significant substitution of sales between the Lottery and society lotteries to date."

It is with the most profound regret that we report the death of one of our founder members, Vice President and former Chairman, Tony Shaw. A serious athlete and long-distance runner in the 1960s, he worked as an area manager for the Cancer and Polio Research Fund football pools. Understanding well the power of prize-led fundraising to benefit a wider section of society, he was among the first to see the potential of the new freedoms of the 1976 Lotteries and Amusements Act to achieve this.

If your society lottery has proceeds which exceed \u00a320,000 for a single draw or aggregated proceeds exceed \u00a3250,000 in a calendar year then you need to apply for a licence from us. Societies may employ an external lottery manager (ELM) to run all or part of their lottery. ELMs must be ...

Fundraising with small society lotteries

Society lotteries raised over \u00a3255 million for good causes in 2016/17 but the individual draw limit for large society lotteries was last raised in 2009. The Gambling Act sets the current limits for society lotteries as \u00a34 million sales per draw, \u00a310 million sales per year and a maximum draw prize of \u00a3400,000.
