In modern usage, "Gentile" applies to a single individual, although occasionally (as in English translations of the Bible) "the Gentiles" means "the nations." In postbiblical Hebrew, goy came to mean an individual non-Jew rather than a nation.

The Greek word most often translated to gentile is *ethnos*. This word means nations or people. In the Bible, when this word is used, it is not describing one nation or ethnic group, rather the term gentile refers to anyone who is not of Jewish descent. Gentiles - Their Meaning from the Bible

Generally, when we see the word Gentile we should think about non-Jews because in the Greek the word Gentiles is “ethnos” or nations. To be a Gentile is to be someone who is not Jewish. When the word Gentile appears in the Old Testament it is from the Hebrew word “goy” which means the same thing as the Greek word does; nation or nations, depending upon whether the singular or plural is being used.
