A study of 500 women prisoners found that women in custody are five times more likely to have a mental health concern than women in the general population, with 78% exhibiting some level of psychological disturbance, compared with a figure of 15% for the general adult female population19.

Although women are less than 5% of those in prison, they account for over 19% of self harm incidents, an indication of the traumatic impact of imprisonment on many. Women entering prison are more likely to have been imprisoned for non-violent offences. Women in prison are highly likely to be victims as well as offenders. Over half the women in prison report having suffered domestic violence with 53% of women reporting having experienced emotional, physical or sexual abuse as a child.
